Ranch Menu for People & Animals

- ❑ Home of Life Leaders Ranch (nonprofit) programs—Ranch Day for teachers, students...
- ❑ Ranch Room for seminars, workshops, meetings: 55” display, WIFI, kitchen, fireplace...
- ❑ Ranch Day events for children/families: photos with horses, picnic, ponds...
- ❑ Horse pasture boarding on 4, 6, or 10 acres. Travelers, bring your horse and sleeper trailer for overnight rest or stay in a B&B or motel nearby (until the barn apartment is ready).
- ❑ Equine assisted coaching (planning & personal leadership with a person & horse partners)
- ❑ Firewood: oak logs split, round, or mixed. Also: pine and sweet gum for outside fire pits.
- ❑ Dog boarding: Freedom fence dog enclosure and back yard, inside night or bad weather.
- ❑ Mint plants to help control fleas in your dog and cat yards, gardens, enclosures.
- ❑ Freedom Fence for dogs and cats: consulting, designs, construction.
- ❑ Photography: farm/ranch settings such as horses, barn, magnolias, ponds, woods...

Organic Food for your Health & Energy

Natural Composts—No harmful chemicals used.

Fruits

- ❑ Blueberry orchard: order and picked for you or U Pick and donate
- ❑ Planted in new orchard: Fig, Apple, Pear, Plum, Peach, Nectarine, Cherry
- ❑ Possible additions 2019: Strawberries, Blackberries
- ❑ Considering (your interest welcome): Farm fresh Chicken eggs, Melons, Pumpkins...

Veggies

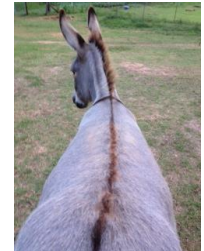
- ❑ Planned 2019: Tomatoes, Okra, Cucumber, Bell pepper, Beans...
- ❑ Considering for people: Watermelon, Cantaloupe, Eggplant...
- ❑ Horses love these: Carrots, Corn, Cucumber, Watermelon

Plants, Trees, and Seeds

- ❑ Mint (use here in pet gardens—repels fleas, smells great, tastes good in beverages...)
- ❑ Heirloom seeds harvested here: Giant Okra, moon flower (can order plants growing in pots)
- ❑ Jumbo Elephant Ears (grown and shared 20 years originally from grandmother's farmhouse)
- ❑ Banana Trees (grown and shared 20 years, originals from parents' lake home)
- ❑ Tree saplings: oak, cedar, pine (harvested from pasture & tree line instead of bush hog)

❑ Patriot's Poop Natural Equine Fertilizer

- ◆ Fed grass, grain, hay, garden veggies, fruit
- ◆ Drink pond water & city water in troughs
- ◆ No artificial de-wormers ingested or injected
- ◆ Can put in 50# recycled horse feed bags.

Know Your Farmer's Practices for Providing Your Food

- ◆ Fertilizer: NO harmful fertilizers or pesticides added to your food that can get absorbed in to you. Use natural, sustainable practices to enrich/fertilize soil for better growth and nutrition (leaves, horse manure, wood chips, grass clippings, pruned twigs and leaves...)
- ◆ Insect control: mint near in dog and cat gardens, dust with food grade Diatomaceous Earth.
- ◆ Weed control: wood chips, leaves, shallow tilling when we must, vinegar, pull...
- ◆ Planted and harvested by hand.
